<u>Task 1:</u> Using 'pattern' create a 'negative space typography' illustration. Choose an appropriate short word or even your first name to complete your work. Search for 'zentangle patterns' on the internet for inspiration.



Your negative space word should emerge from your chosen pattern (it should not have an outline). Varied strengths of line are needed so use media that will allow you to achieve strong heavy lines alongside soft delicate lines. You can choose to work in black & white or add colour when your pattern work is complete. Work in an old sketchbook, not on lined or printer paper – your completed work should be no bigger than A5.

Use this example by designer Lex Wilson as a guide.

<u>Task 2</u>: On the right, is a list of designers who use typography in a creative manner. Choose your favourite 4 artists from the list and create one of the following words in their style: 'Font', 'Type' 'Text' and 'Caps'. Work no bigger than A5 for each word.
